




**THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
THE REPUBLIC OF INDONESIA**

**Strengthening Cooperation between the Two Nations - The Meeting
Between the Chairman of BKSAP, Dr. Fadli Zon and the Deputy Speaker
of Hungarian Parliament, H.E. Istvan Jakab, on February 11, 2020.**



On February 11, 2020, the Chairman of BKSAP, Dr. Fadli Zon received a visit from the Deputy Speaker of Hungarian Parliament, H.E. Istvan Jakab and his delegation to discuss ways of strengthening cooperation between the two countries. During the meeting, the Chairman of BKSAP was also accompanied by the Vice Chairman of BKSAP, Putu Supadma Rudana. The Hungarian Ambassador to Indonesia, H.E. Judit Pach, along with his delegation attended the meeting as well.

Both parties agreed that Parliaments have a crucial role in improving the relations between the two countries; especially Parliaments are the representatives of the people, and have a function to make sound decisions on various policies.

It is reported that the Indonesian Parliament will formalize the formation of the Bilateral Cooperation Group with various countries, including Hungary at the end of this February.

To strengthen relations between the two countries, both parties underlined the importance of mutual visits between high-ranking officials. In this regard, the Deputy Speaker said that the President of Hungary will visit Indonesia at the end of March, and conveyed an invitation to the Speaker and the Deputy Speaker of the Indonesian Parliament to visit Hungary.



Furthermore, Hungary will also be the host of the Parliamentary Intelligence Forum in May. They also hope that the Indonesian Parliament can send their delegations to participate and attend the forum. Indonesia will also host the Speaker of Eurasia Countries meeting, which will take place in Bali this November. Similarly, BKSAP hopes that Hungary will be able to attend the meeting.

Indonesia is committed to achieving SDGs, and has adopted and implemented measures to attain the 2030 Agenda and its goals and targets. The country has hosted a number of meetings and consultations, including the World Parliamentary Forum on Sustainable Development (WPFSD), which will be held again in 2021. Besides, Indonesia will also host the Inter-Parliamentary Union meeting in 2022.
